I think that we, as the people of Morwell were let down by not being told enough about all the aspects of the fire. Also why are we left to clean up after the fire. We people of Morwell did not start the fire. It was deliberately lit. Why were the sprinklers not there any more? Why wasn't there grass planted like there was supposed to be or are they all ruminors?

Why is the Dept of Human Services paying for all the cleaning tools etc. They have nothing to do with the owners of the mine, do they?

The owners of the mine must be made to pay for every house, unit, flat, street and shop to be cleaned from top to bottom inside and out. Why should we have to clean our places or put a claim in our insurance policies if we have them?

How many elderly have had a stroke, heart attack or Asthma as a direct result of the live.

Maxwell still smells, I only get home once a week for a few hrs at the moment and I can smell the lives results.
