## For all principals

### Main Points

- Due to fire activity across Victoria, smoke may be visible in many areas.
- · Children, the elderly and those with existing heart or lung conditions, are advised to limit prolonged or heavy physical activity.

#### Actions Required

- Principals are to monitor conditions via emergency information services.
- Principals are to take appropriate precautions for the health and wellbeing of staff and students, particularly those with heart and respiratory conditions.
- Principals to ensure that this occurs for students at school and on camp or excursions.
