Stepping back in time

Morwell school kids leapt at the chance to leave the smoke behind and become pioneers, writes Jane Howard

SIXTY-THREE students from Years 3-6 at Morwell Primary School escaped the smoke and ash that have covered the own for the past six weeks due to the Hazelwood coal mine fire

The students and 10 teachers and staff, enjoyed some welcome respite at the Swan Hill Pioneer Settlement

Nestled on the banks of the Marraboor River at the

settlement, the students had an opportunity to step back in

The breathing difficulties, headaches, sore eyes and nausea caused by the fire. seemed a million miles away.

The Morwell visitors revelled in the chance to dressup "pioneer-style", and ride on the PS Pyap, a large paddle boat for a river cruise. Other activities included

butter churning, rope making, building, blacksmithing, working an "olden days" laundry, plus horse-and-cart and vintage-car rides.

Australian history came to life as the children filed into the Pine Point Pioneer School. lent elbow grease to construct drop-log buildings and learnt about local indigenous culture.

Even the streetscanes echoed another age with 1850s smoke — you grin and bear it

pioneer cottages, Towaninnie Homestead and more than 50 original and replica heritage buildings forming a Mallee township from a bygone era.

"They absolutely loved it, they were so excited, they said it was the best camp they had ever been on," said Ms Merle Williamson, Morwell PS community link co-ordinator.

"We've been enduring the


— but we've had stinging eyes, sinus, sore throats and it affects breathing. It's been hard for the children with asthma

"It's been hard on all the children as they have had to stay indoors"

Ms Williamson said the children loved making butter and ropes and, with the help of a blacksmith, a nail which they can keep as a memento.

Nic Quenault, Year 3 and 4 and PE teacher said the Swan Hill visit was ideal for the children who would study the 1800s and early settlers in Australian history in term 2.

He said the visit was great from a teaching perspective as it gave insight into Koori culture and reinforced work the children had already done on local settlers and Aboriginal people.

Morwell PS community links condinator Merle Williamson said the students learned about and practised butter churning, pull sawing clothes waehing and rope making among other activities.


The students also weat on a paddle steam boat four and horse and cart and wintage cars rides.


Principal Pete Harratty said Swan Hill Rural City Council, which operates the settlement, provided free accommodation, an education program and the rides.


Mr Hanratty and Swan Hill offered this "fantastic deal" to all Morwell schools via Latrobe City Council.




Tasks: Students learn how to make a rope.




