Situation Summary	Today and tomorrow (Sunday 9 th February) have been declared days of Total Fire Ban across the State. Fire danger ratings today are either severe or very high across the state. Fire danger ratings tomorrow are very high, severe, or extreme (Northern Country, North East, East Gippsland) across the state. Very hot temperatures and strong winds are expected this weekend with temperatures above 40 degrees today, and strong winds continuing into Sunday.		
	There is a risk of dry thunderstorms (lightening) developing near the coast during this afternoon. The greatest risk is in the South West.		
	A number of new fire starts from lightening overnight in the Gippsland region as well as 3 ongoing main fire clusters:		
	 Goongerah cluster - recommendation to evacuate with SEWS issued (27 homes visited, 9 have indicated they will stay) 		
	Club Terrace and Snowy River clusters		
	 Hernes Oak – concern for potential further activity overnight and rapid spread. Evacuation planning in progress. 		
	Heat Health Alerts were issued for today for every district except the North East district and East Gippsland district.		
	Recovery coordination for the Grampians Northern Complex fire is ongoing.		
Known impacts	There are currently no known impacts in relation to the Heat Health Alert.		
	Recovery activities continue in support of the impacts that have arisen from the January 2014 fires.		

SUMMARY OF ACTIV	TITIES:
Health Command/Coordination	All health services in East Gippsland have been appraised of the latest fire information and have been undertaking preparedness work. The Gelantipy Bush Nursing Centre is putting arrangements in place to manage the risk.
Health Protection	REMT and DH Environmental Health Officer monitoring water supply situation relating to the limited capacity of water treatment plants in the townships of Euro and Violet Town.
	A review of forecast temperature data released this morning showed today's Heat Health Alerts for the South West and Wimmera districts were no longer warranted. No adjustments will be made to Heat Health Alert messages.
Human Services Command	DHS program areas were advised of risk situation on the 7 th of February 2014.
	Disability Accommodation Services:
	Eastern Metropolitan - increased risk mitigation in regards to a property in extreme risk area
	Hume – one property relocation will take place tomorrow
	Gippsland – working with Traralgon Incident Controller regarding potential overnight threat to 2 homes
	Child Protection Services:
	Eastern Metropolitan Region – risk mitigation strategies undertaken
	Hume – agencies with responsibilities to move clients in an Extreme FDR notified
	Personal Hardship Assistance officers remain on a shadow roster in Gippsland in case they are required.
Relief (inc Red Cross)	3 relief centres are operating to support East Gippsland communities at Orbost, Cann River, Delegate (NSW). Contingency planning in place for fall back from Delegate if required.
	Evacuation planning for Hernes Oak may necessitate the opening of a relief centre – TBA.
	Relief agencies are aware of heatwave conditions, and also the fire risk and put further standby arrangements in place. The Salvation Army, and Victorian Council of Churches are operational at the local level, the Red Cross is operational at the state and local level.
	As at 1700hrs today no one has attended any of the relief centres in Gippsland.
Recovery	Recovery operations continue for previous fires, and are being managed through the January 2014 Bushfires - State Recovery Coordination Team.
Communications / Public Information	www.recovery.vic.gov.au has been updated with the latest information about East Gippsland relief centres.
1 done information	A community meeting will be held in Cann River at the relief centre at 4:00pm today (8 th February 2014).
