# SITUATION SUMMARY: Situation Summary The Hazelwood open cut mine fire in the Latrobe Valley remains a key priority. On Friday 28 Feb 2014, a recommendation was issued for 'at risk' people who live or work in the South Morwell area to relocate away from near the open cut mine. Victoria's Chief Health Officer, Dr Rosemary Lester, identified 'at risk' individuals as being: pregnant women residents aged 65 and over pre-school children (under 5 - including babies and infants) anyone with pre-existing heart or lung conditions. Individuals 'at risk' are being encouraged to organise their own accommodation and transport if they have the means to do so. Help is available, however, for those who are unable to organise suitable accommodation or transport for themselves. Individuals in these circumstances are being advised to contact the Department of Human Services hotline to make an appointment to speak with a DHS officer in person at one of three locations in Morwell. Residents in other parts of Morwell are encouraged to periodically take respite from the smoke. In East Gippsland two significant bushfires are not yet under control (Goongerah-Deddick Trail and Timbarra - Gil Groggin). The smoke issues associated with the Hazelwood Mine fire continue to affect the Morwell community. Known impacts

# **SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES:**

#### Health

On Tuesday 04 March 2014, 74 clients attended the Community Health Assessment Centre.

As at COB Tuesday 04 March 2014, there have been 1553 clients attend since the opening on 21 February 2014.

Larger GP practices have reported moderate-significant increases in patient presentations with COPD exacerbation, non-seasonal asthma, anxiety related to smoke/ash/gases, throat & eye irritation, headaches, nausea, vomiting, breathing difficulties, and blurred vision. GPs report they are working at full capacity, but so far have not needed to extend opening hours. Some practices report a decrease in patient demand, and attribute this to people not wishing to expose themselves to the smoke/ash. The CHO met with GPs, Health Service Board members and CEOs in Morwell yesterday and will meet additional GPs tonight.

Overall presentations to Latrobe Regional Hospital are above usual numbers, but the hospital reports these presentations are not related to the Latrobe Valley Mine fire.

The Nurse on Call (NoC) service has noted a small increase in demand and continues to be being actively promoted within the community.

Advice on the use of air purifiers is "Insufficient evidence exists to promote air cleaners as an effective way of removing all hazards from indoor air pollution. Furthermore the use of these devices may conflict with current health advice and messaging". A community information sheet regarding the use of air purifiers is in the process of being developed.

#### **EM Workforce**

A number of DHS staff continue to be deployed to Gippsland to assist with regional emergency management operations in Morwell.

Staffing numbers deployed for DH and DHS for Wednesday 5 March 2014 are:

- 3 DH staff at regional level in Gippsland and 20 DH staff at state level
- 88 DHS staff at regional level in Gippsland and 14 DHS staff at state level.

Impacts on DHS funded services and DHS clients are being monitored and regular contact is being maintained as required.

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#### Relief (inc Red Cross)

The Community Respite Centre in Moe remains open from 9am – 6pm daily. Today twelve people accessed the centre (as at 16.30 hours). The centre offers current information on the situation, health and environmental fact sheets, psychosocial support, and food and fluids (tea, coffee biscuits).

DHS and Latrobe City Council continue to operate a Community Information and Recovery Centre in Morwell to provide support and information to residents in a local, air-conditioned environment. Latrobe City Council, DHS, Red Cross, Ambulance Victoria and other key agencies are in attendance. As at 16.30 today, 89 people had attended and one health check undertaken.

Upon the direction of VicPol, Red Cross has activated on-line registration for Register. Find. Reunite. People planning to relocate are being encouraged to register. A total of 3,190 people have registered.

# Recovery

Recovery planning is now well underway in East Gippsland, the Grampians, Hume, Loddon-Mallee and North and West Metropolitan regions for the fires in January and February 2014.
