SITUATION SUMM	ARY:
Situation Summary	This report is focussed on the Hazelwood open cut mine fire in the Latrobe Valley and the bushfires in East Gippsland. The East Gippsland, Goongerah-Deddick Trail fire was declared CONTAINED on Monday 10 March. The Hazelwood open cut mine fire was declared CONTROLLED on Monday 10 March.
	On Friday 21 March the northern batters of the Hazelwood open cut mine fire were declared 'safe'. This has been the critical fire area causing concern to the community. Remaining hot spots are being monitored and extinguished.
	On Monday 17 March the Chief Health Officer (CHO) lifted the advice for temporary relocation of 'at risk' groups in the southern parts of Morwell, advising that they can now plan to return to their homes and workplaces. This advice was based on an improvement in air quality and confirmation from the Fire Services Commissioner that the fire in the mine is contained. The EPA will continue to monitor the air quality in the Latrobe Valley for the next 12 months.
	There has been additional fire activity across the state today, in Healesville in particular. Most of these fires are either contained or controlled. DHS clients and funded services are being monitored for any potential impacts.

	Clients and services The impact on DHS funded services and DHS clients has been significantly reduced due to reduced numbers of staff being utilised.


