Situation Summary	On Tuesday 25 March the Hazelwood open cut mine fire was officially declared as 'safe'. The site has now been handed back to mine owner GDF Suez. The mine owners and workers will continue to monitor small hotspots in the mine.		
	On Monday 17 March the Chief Health Officer (CHO) lifted the advice for temporary relocation of 'at risk' groups in the southern parts of Morwell, advising that they can now plan to return to their homes and workplaces.		
	The Environment Protection Agency will continue to monitor the air quality in the Latrobe Valley for the next 12 months.

Health	Numbers of people attending the Community Health Assessment Centre (CHAC) continue to be low. As at COB Tuesday 25 March 2014, there have been 2109 clients attend since the opening on 21 February 2014. The facility is planned to be closed at COB Sunday 30 March 2014. All local GPs and health facilities have been informed and the impact of the closure will be monitored until 4 April 2014.			
	Health services, GP's and Nurse on Call continue to manage any demand within existing resources.			
	Cleaning of the St Hilary's aged care service has commenced and a strategy developed for the staggered return of residents. The exact schedule for this is still unknown.			
Human Services Command	The DHS Hotline 1800 number for respite and relocation assistance has now reverted to a recorded message providing information to callers. This occurred as of close of business Friday 21 March 2014.			
	DHS implemented a fraud management process to review cases of possible inappropriate access to payments. Where identified these cases are being referred to Victoria Police for investigation.
