# **SITUATION SUMMARY:** The Hazelwood open cut mine fire in the Latrobe Valley remains a key priority. Multiple emergency and Situation Summary government agencies are managing the risks generated by this fire. This afternoon an advice was issued for 'at risk' people who live in the southern Morwell area near the mine to relocate away from the smoke. Victoria's Chief Health Officer, Dr Rosemary Lester, identified 'at risk' individuals as being: pregnant women residents aged 65 and over pre-schol children (under 5 - including babies and infants) anyone with pre-existing heart or lung conditions Help is available for those who are unable to organise suitable accommodation or transport for themselves. Individuals in these circumstances are being advised to ring DHS to make an appointment to speak with a DHS officer in person at one of four locations in Morwell. In East Gippsland two significant bushfires are not yet under control (Goongerah-Deddick Trail and Timbarra - Gil Groggin). Fire activity has subsided and there is currently no threat to community. Recovery planning is now well underway in East Gippsland, the Grampians, Hume, Loddon-Mallee and North and West Metropolitan regions for the fires in January and February 2014. Known impacts The smoke issues associated with the Hazelwood Mine fire continue to affect the Morwell community.

SUMMARY OF ACTIV	/ITIES:
Health Command/Coordination	Ambulance Victoria (AV) continues to support the Latrobe Valley community and the Emergency Service Organisations combating the fires in Gippsland.
	There have been 886 clients attend the Community Health Assessment Centre since opening on 21 February 2014. 117 of these have been referred to other health services. As at 1200hrs today, 74 clients have attended the centre.
	Following advice from the Chief Health Officer, Baptcare St Hilary's Community Aged Care facility has decided to re locate their residents. The relocation will occur on Saturday 01 March with support from Ambulance Victoria.
	Latrobe Regional Hospital presentations are within normal limits. Some General Practices are experiencing increased demand, but are coping.
	The Nurse on Call (NoC) service is being actively promoted within the community, through Health Centres, General Practitioners and at the Community Health Assessment Centre. A small increase in demand has been noted.
Health Protection	The Chief Health Officer has today advised people aged over 65, pre-school aged children, pregnant women and anyone with a pre-existing heart or lung condition living or working in Morwell South to consider temporary relocation because of the Hazelwood mine fire.

	The Chief Health Officer, Premier, Chief Commissioner of Police, and the Fire Services Commissioner attended a media conference at the Traralgon ICC today announcing the temporary relocation advice for at risk groups of the Morwell South community.
Human Services Command	DHS resources continue to be deployed to the Gippsland region to assist regional DHS emergency management operations in Morwell.
	DHS funded services and DHS clients have been contacted and are being provided with information on the current situation by the Morwell office.
Relief (inc Red Cross)	DHS and Latrobe City Council have opened a Community Information and Recovery Centre in Morwell to provide support and information to Morwell residents in a local, air-conditioned environment. This centre is supported by Latrobe City Council, DHS, Red Cross, Victorian Council of Churches and other key agencies. Thirty people attended today.
	Approximately 150 people have accessed the Community Respite Centre in Moe for relief and information (10 today). Services on offer include psychosocial support (from Red Cross and Victorian Council of Churches), fire

information (from CFA and Victoria Police), health information (from Ambulance Victoria and EPA), child friendly spaces, food and fluids (tea, coffee and snacks). Latrobe council are providing a bus service to the respite centre, subject to demand.

Additional locations have now been activated to cater for individuals making an appointment to meet with a DHS officer in response to today's announcement regarding relocation.

As at 1900hrs today the call centre managing appointments for Personal Hardship Respite Payments and Personal Hardship Voluntary Relocation Payments had received 723 calls for the day. Of these, 163 were for relocation assistance and 560 were for respite.

As at 1620hrs today, a total of 54 appointments with affected members of the public had been held at the Morwell DHS office for the issuing of Personal Hardship Respite Payments.

As at 1620hrs today, no Personal Hardship Voluntary Relocation Payment appointments or payments had been made.

As at 1620hrs today, no members of the community had approached the Department of Human Services for assistance with finding accommodation for the purposes of relocation.

Red Cross has activated on-line registration for Register. Find. Reunite. People planning to relocate are being encouraged to register.

A free bus service remains available for Morwell residents to attend the Boolarra Folk Festival on Saturday 1 March as an opportunity to take respite from the area.

Recovery

DHS and partner agencies continue to support affected communities through community meetings and outreach programs in conjunction with local governments. Psycho-social issues continue to be identified and monitored.

Communications and Public Information activities today have included:

- preparing Q&As, web copy and fact sheets about relocation
- participation in the Health Incident Management Team
- participation in the EMJPIC Teleconference
- updating content on the Department of Health and Recovery websites, as well as the Victorian Emergency Recovery Information Line
- media monitoring across multiple channels
- liaising with Health and Human Services Communications staff in Morwell
- briefing and deploying Communications staff to Gippsland Regional Emergency Operations Centre.
