SITUATION SUMMA	RY:		
Situation Summary	There are currently three significant incidents going:		
	 Morwell – Hernes Oak bushfire and Hazelwood Mine fire – involves complex resourcing, community, coalmine & power industry, with potential infrastructure impacts East Gippsland bushfires – multiple complexes of large forest fires in difficult terrain that will take several weeks to contain without significant moderation in weather (rain). Mickleham - Kilmore bushfire – Isolated pockets still burning, with emergency stabilization and community recovery commencing. 		
	While there is some rain expected it is not expected to have a significant impact on current fires.		
	The fires at Hazelwood and Yallourn open cut coal mines are producing smoke and also carbon monoxide due to the incomplete burning of the coal. There is a health management plan in place.		
	Recovery activities are ongoing in the Grampians region and are now underway in the recently affected communities.		
Known impacts	Smoke haze continues to be visible across many areas of the state.		
	Approximately 45 houses have been confirmed destroyed since Saturday 8 February. It is believed hundreds of cattle and thousands of sheep, along with pasture and feed have been lost in these fires.		

SUMMARY OF ACTIV	/ITIES:
Health Command/Coordination	A Health and Human Services Liaison Officer is working in the Hazelwood Incident Control Centre for the Hazelwood Mine Fire to support the Incident Management Team. This will continue through the weekend.
	Department of Health staff (included the Regional Health Coordinator) attended the Morwell community meeting on Friday 14/02/2014. The Latrobe Valley Mine Fire Community Information sheet was distributed at this meeting.
Health Protection	Department of Health representatives attended the community meeting in Morwell relating to the mine fires and provided information on health which was well received.
	Smoke persists in the atmosphere and is being monitored by Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Victoria, bushfire smoke advisory will be issued as required. Air quality monitoring continues to be undertaken by the EPA near fire affected areas around the state. There is a particular focus with extra resources on the LaTrobe Valley. A watch and act was issued earlier today for Morwell following the detection of a spike in Carbon Monoxide levels. This was downgraded after 3 hours.
	Key messages relating to health and bushfires continue to be included in the whole of government media strategy which includes print media and radio. The Chief Health Officer has undertaken a number of interviews over the last few days with key media throughout metro and regional Victoria in relation to the health affects of bushfire smoke. The Department of Health is liaising with the regions to ensure that messages around bushfire smoke and health are being targeted appropriately.
	The Health Emergency Management Liaison Officer deployed for the Hazelwood Fire Incident will be replaced this weekend.
	There are no water quality or drinking water supply issues in fire affected areas except for Romsey where a restriction on use has been applied while repairs are effected. The Department of Health continues to liaise with water authorities.
Human Services Command	Financial assistance payments officers and liaison officers are present at recovery centres, providing emergency relief and emergency re-establishment payments, as required.
Relief (inc Red Cross)	All relief centres have now become recovery centres or have closed.
	Red Cross Volunteers continue to provide food and water to CFA personnel at the staging ground. Red Cross provided 400 meals for dinner, 315 meals at midnight and 400 at breakfast. Red Cross expects to continue to provide food and water at this site for a number of days. Ambulance Victoria is testing all volunteers for CO2 levels every shift.
Recovery	The State Crisis and Resilience '2014 Bushfires - State Recovery Coordination Team' met on Friday 14/2/14 and agreed to continue to meet weekly to coordinate the recovery for the January and February 2014 fires.
Version: May 2013	DHS and partner agencies continue to support affected communities at recovery centres and community meetings, and through outreach programs. There are currently six recovery centres in operation. Outreach programs and

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	psychosocial support are being provided in conjunction with local governments.		
	DHS staff are attending community meetings and monitoring social media so that priority issues raised by community are noted and responded to.		
Communications / Public Information	A whole of Victorian Government communications plan for the Victorian Bushfires Recovery has been completed, and the 2014 Victorian Bushfires Recovery Guide to Services has been launched.		
	There are ongoing updates to relief and recovery content on www.recovery.vic.gov.au, the Victorian Emergency Recovery Information Line and social media messaging.		
	Health and Human Services continues to monitor key issues health issues associated with the Hazelwood mine fires and collaborate with the Whole of Victorian Government Emergency Management Joint Public Information Committee.		
Business Continuity	Health and Human Services State Operations has organised the deployment of staff from central officer and other areas to provide support to the Hume region.
