SITUATION SUMM	ARY:
Situation Summary	Fire Danger Ratings across the state remained high to very high today and are forecasted to remain high to very high up until Friday, when they are currently predicted to be low-moderate across the state. Rain is expected to provide some relief by Friday.
	There are still several ongoing fires across the state including the Mickleham Kilmore bushfire (imminent danger to communities), Hazelwood – Morewell fire, and East Gippsland bushfires. There are currently no Emergency Warnings, and 5 Watch and Acts, but the situation remains fluid.
	Recovery planning is under way in relation to the Warrandyte and Gisborne fires, and ongoing in the Grampians.
Known impacts	Health impacts of smoke are impacting a number of areas across the state. Regions have also raised concerns about the psychosocial impacts of the fires, particularly in areas previously affected.
	21 houses have been confirmed destroyed across the state since Saturday. The fire in the Hazelwood coal mine is likely to reduce electricity production and is expected to burn for up to a month. The direct and indirect impacts and loss of production at the Maryvale paper mill is regionally significant.
	Further impacts are being confirmed through initial impact assessments coordinated by Victoria Police.

SUMMARY OF ACTIV	SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES:			
Health Command/Coordination	The Ambulance Emergency Operations Centre is active through to midnight each day with ongoing contact available, supplemented by a liaison officer in the State Control Centre. Liaison unlikely to continue for 24 hours with a stand down at midnight tonight until 7:00am tomorrow.			
	Health Commanders are in or available to five Incident Control Centres including Seymour, Traralgon, Bairnsdale, Traralgon Regional Control Centre, and Orbost. Strike teams deployed to Mickleham - Kilmore complex and Morwell open cut mine fire. The strike team for Kilmore is deployed until 1:00am each day until further notice.			
	The strike team for Morwell consists of a Health Commander and Response crew. Ambulance Victoria has received a request for a two week deployment of this configuration 24/7. The task is to support the fire response.			
	First aid support continues at Kilmore and Wallan 24/7. Today first aid support also provided at Romsey. The need for ongoing first aid support will be reassessed at 6:00pm each day.			
	Health and Aged Care services in Wallan and Kilmore have both been under threat from fire in the past 24 hours. Both Regional Health Commander and Coordinator have confirmed that all of these facilities have plans in place and are well prepared to shelter in place with support from CFA.			
Health Protection	The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Victoria has issued a low level bushfire smoke advisory for the we of the Latrobe Valley and in the Geelong area as a result of bushfires. Air quality monitoring continues to be undertaken by the EPA near fire affected areas around the state. The Department of Health is liaising with the regions to ensure that messages around bushfire smoke and health are being targeted appropriately.			
	Key messages relating to Health and Bushfires are being included in the whole of government media strategy which includes print media and radio. The Chief Health Officer has undertaken a number of interviews today with key media throughout metro and regional Victoria in relation to the health effects of bushfire smoke.			
	There are no water quality or drinking water supply issues in fire affected areas. The Department of Health continues to liaise with water authorities.			
Human Services Command	Financial assistance payments officers and liaison officers have been deployed as required.			
	Gippsland – due to smoke haze and general atmospheric conditions a DHS service agency sent staff home at 1:00pm today. All clients affected by this were notified and it is expected that the facility will reopen tomorrow (Wednesday 12 February). All DHS facilities that relocated during the fires have now returned. Two child protection clients have been affected by a house loss. Follow-up is occurring.			
	Disability Accommodation service in Nurmurkah was suspended and resumption of services is being reconsidered this afternoon.			
Relief (inc Red Cross)	As at 1500hrs relief centres are currently open at Wallan, Seymour and Delegate. Relief partner agencies are providing food and water, material aid and personal support. Community meetings are occurring as needed. Red Cross providing first aid, and food and water to emergency service at Hazelwood Staging Ground.			
Recovery	The State Crisis and Resilience '2014 Bushfires - State Recovery Coordination Team' will meet on Friday 14 February to discuss the January and February 2014 fires, including the current situation and recovery activities.			
	 There are several Local or Regional Recovery Committee meetings scheduled across the state: Hume Regional recovery meeting was scheduled for Thursday 13 February, due to ongoing fire activity this 			

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	 has been rescheduled . Manningham is currently considering setting up a Recovery Committee. Gippsland Regional Recovery Committee meeting is planned for Friday 14 February. The Gisborne Recovery Committee met today. Planning is underway with the transition to recovery planned for the Malmsbury and Dalrymple Rd fires first, and the Mickleham Rd fire at a later stage. 		
Communications / Public Information	There are ongoing updates to www.recovery.vic.gov.au and the Victorian Emergency Recovery Information Line content. Key priority has been the drafting and distribution of new media lines regarding relief counselling servic to the Emergency Management Joint Public Information Committee and State Control Centre for media use, as well as the distribution of relief and recovery social media messaging.		
	Input has been provided for the Whole of Victorian Government public information campaign (Week 1). Information has been provided to the Emergency Management Joint Public Information Committee Teleconference at 4:30pm. Continuing to respond to various media inquiries and liaise with DHS regions regarding media/communications issues.		
Business Continuity	Emergency Management resourcing is at capacity in the Hume region and additional support is being supplied from the Eastern Metropolitan region. The Eastern Metropolitan region is consequently experiencing impacts to the Corporate Services, Client Outcome and Service Improvement portfolios. Morwell DHS office has reopened.

Issue Actions taken	Eastern Metropolitan Region – Lack of impact assessment information in Manningham and Yarra Ranges, but are working with LGAs and DEPI to obtain this information. Recovery Planning (Manningham).
