Latrobe Valley Open Cut Mine Fires

February 20 2014 1500hrs

The Firefighting Effort

Fire agencies and mine personnel are working around the clock on fire suppression activities at both mines.

Safety of firefighters and community members is the most important consideration in this incident.

Hazelwood Open Cut Mine Fire

The fire fight at Hazelwood open cut involves over 200 fire fighters, 100 mine staff, 60 incident management team personnel, and nine medical monitoring personnel. They are supported by numerous tankers, heavy pumping vehicles, other vehicles including eight large aerial ladder vehicles and aircraft.

Observational reports from ground and aircraft has indicated that significant progress has been made. Firefighters continue to plan for the containment and suppression including the management of smoke of the fire by utilising expertise from local, state and national sources throughout all agencies. Community safety remains a prime consideration in the planning of the suppression of this fire.

Yallourn Open Cut Mine Fire

The management of the Yallourn mine fire is expected to be handed back to local control, but will continue to be supported by Victorian Emergency Services.

Air Quality and Health

Air quality is being monitored by EPA, emergency services and Hazmat technicians. Both fine particles and carbon monoxide are being measured as indicators of the impacts of smoke on local air quality. Data is being collected at Morwell East and is now being updated hourly on their website.

Local air quality is currently being affected by smoke and ash from burning brown coal. The primary health concerns are respiratory irritation, skin contact or irritation to the eyes.

How smoke affects you depends on your age, pre-existing medical conditions such as asthma or heart disease, and the length of time you are exposed.

It is very important that people with pre-existing health conditions take their medication, follow

their treatment plan, and seek immediate medical advice if symptoms occur.

The levels of smoke in and around the Valley are highly variable, depending on the weather conditions.

Winds may strengthen westerly to 40-60kph today. Yesterday's strong winds over the fire area caused some damage to the staging area, but has since been repaired.

Roads

While the recent fire has caused damage to vegetation, signs and safety barriers along the Princes Freeway at Morwell, VicRoads advise there has been no damage to the surface of the road.

Works to remove vegetation and repair signs and safety barriers will continue in the coming weeks.

While these works are being undertaken, some lane closures and reduced speed limits will be required for the safety of drivers and workers.
