HAZELWOOD OPEN CUT MINE FIRE

Firefighters continue to work around the clock, supported by aircraft. Efforts will be focussed on continuing to reduce the fire and smoke within the coal mine in order to protect the community and infrastructure.

85% of the fire has been contained. The focus over the next few days will be continuing to consolidate the northern batters (wall) and the eastern end of the southern batter (wall), to ensure smoke reduction towards the Morwell area.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION AND RECOVERY CENTRE:

A Community Information and Recovery Centre in Morwell has also been opened at 22 Hazelwood Road, Morwell.

Opening hours are 9am - 6pm daily.

HEALTH ASSESSMENT CENTRE

Regional Office Ambulance Victoria Gippsland 2 Saskia Way, Morwell (pictured top right) (Next to the Mid-Valley Shopping Centre) Opening hours 8.00am to 8.00pm every day Visit this centre if you would like a free health assessment in relation to the effects of the mine fire and the smoky conditions.

The centre has increased its numbers of staff to accommodate the community needs. Qualified nurses and paramedics will offer primary health assessments, including basic respiratory, blood pressure, heart rate and temperature checks. Should anyone require medical care they will be referred to either their own Doctor or to Latrobe Regional Hospital.



RELOCATION ASSISTANCE

Relocation assistance is available for Morwell residents south of the railway line affected by the Hazelwood open cut mine fire.

The Department of Human Services will arrange suitable accommodation for those identified as 'at risk' who can't find their own accommodation.

This will be found as close to Morwell as possible.

LATROBE CITY COUNCIL UPDATE

Latrobe City Council has been able to ramp up door to door visits to residents across Morwell, thanks to the aid of a small army of volunteers from other Victorian Councils, the Victorian Council of Churches and the Red Cross.

There are now 42 people working in pairs in an attempt to reach as many community members as possible. The purpose of the visit is to answer questions, understand community concerns and help connect residents with support that is available to them.

Many residents are completing a survey which Council is using to record resident issues and advocate for solutions what will assist them.

As of Tuesday evening, the door to door team has reached almost 2,000 houses and spoken with hundreds of residents, with work to continue in the coming days.

Council is working with local event organisers to create opportunities for residents to take a break from the smoky conditions. Upcoming events include the Sale Music Festival on Sunday 9 March and the Fiddlehead Festival in Yinnar on Saturday 15 March. Bus transportation will be offered. FREE ENTRY OFFERS

Morwell residents seeking respite from the smoky conditions caused by the Hazelwood open-cut fire are being offered free entry into Museum Victoria venues including Melbourne Museum, Scienceworks and the Immigration Museum.

Morwell residents can obtain free entry to these venues by showing address identification at the ticket counters, initially for the month of March.

This offer complements the range of free arts experiences already on offer at Victorian arts agencies:

Arts Centre Melbourne (St Kilda Road): Beatles in Australia Exhibition (from 8 March): An exhibition charting the Beatles' famed 1964 tour of Australia. Features newsreel footage, television reports, magazine clippings and rarely seen objects for fans and collectors.

Australian Centre for the Moving Image

(Federation Square): *Screenworlds:* an interactive exhibition which tells the story of the development of film, television and digital culture.

National Gallery of Victoria (St Kilda Road and The Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia at Federation Square): *Melbourne Now* the largest exhibition ever staged at NGV featuring work from the artists, designers, architects who have shaped Melbourne. Access to the stunning permanent collection is also free.



EPA AIR QUALITY MONITORING UPDATE

Since the fire, EPA Victoria has doubled its air quality monitoring efforts, with 19 fixed and mobile air monitoring stations and devices to measure air quality now in place. The monitoring locations have been selected to ensure they are in the right places to capture overall air quality, to get the most accurate data possible.

This accurate, evidence-based data is provided by EPA scientists to the Department of Health, to assess potential health risks and impacts. This advice is then given to Latrobe Valley residents with any actions required.
