EMERGENCY RELIEF

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial assistance is available to Morwell residents to take a break from the smoke. Contact the Department of Human Services on **1800 006 468** or visit recovery.vic.gov.au

BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

TAKING A BREAK

The Victorian Government and Latrobe City Council are coordinating options for Morwell residents to take a break from the smoke and ash.

Free return tickets for V/Line trains are available from staff at Morwell Station.

Morwell residents can visit free at **Melbourne Zoo, Werribee Zoo and Healesville Sanctuary** by showing address identification at the entry.

Morwell residents can also obtain free entry into Museum Victoria venues, including **Melbourne Museum, Scienceworks and the Immigration Museum**, by showing address identification at the ticket counters. COMMUNITY RESPITE CENTRE

The Moe Town Hall respite centre is open on Albert Street from 9am till 6pm and offers a relaxed air conditioned space to take a break from the smoke.

HEALTH INFORMATION

Temporary relocation away from smoke is recommended for people aged 65 and over, children under five (including infants and babies), pregnant women, and anyone with an existing heart or lung condition living or working in areas south of Commercial Road, Morwell.

If you are staying, try to keep out of the smoke by staying indoors as much as possible, avoid physical exercise outdoors and take a break away from the smoke if possible. Keep taking medications and follow your asthma plan. For more information visit health.vic.gov.au

HEALTH ASSESSMENT CENTRE

Paramedics and nurses are providing free health assessments at the Regional Office of Ambulance Victoria Gippsland at 2 Saskia Way, Morwell. The centre is open from 8am to 8pm. If you need medical care, you will be referred to your doctor or to the Latrobe Regional Hospital.

NURSE-ON-CALL

You can discuss any health related issues with a registered nurse, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for the cost of a local call on **1300 60 60 24**.

AIR QUALITY

The EPA has doubled air quality monitoring in the Latrobe Valley and is issuing regular updates. The EPA will issue a smoke advisory notice if you need to take action. For air quality updates and forecasts, visit epa.vic.gov.au or call **1300 372 842**.

WATER
