Actions from Meeting 14 October 2014:

Operational Preparedness:

Outcomes of Strategic Operations Group meeting conducted 21 October 2014 to review stocktake of priorities and treatments **Outcome:** Priorities reconfirmed for action and treatments progressed via discussion between parties. Ongoing monitoring required

Meeting of group to be conducted at 1100 hours today, 28 October to discuss key directional aspects of the group

Meeting with Vicroads 21 October 2014:

Outcome: Vicroads have undertaken to bring slashing program forward for the key arterial roads in Latrobe City. Furthermore, plantation vegetation not to be replanted on Princes Freeway medium strip to reduce future fuel loadings. Vicroads requested to provide nomination for communications group. Yet to be received. Additional VMS trailers have been purchased for use across Gippsland to better advise communities of works and road conditions.

TFD to write to Vicroads to reconfirm their commitments

Requirement for MFPPC to ensure there is a coordinated approach between LCC and agencies in terms of works being conducted, including priorities, accountabilities and timelines. These must align with the current Latrobe City Fire Management Plan

Latrobe Valley Improvement Plan: This item to be retained in meeting notes for continual revision

Key Themes -

The key themes tabled were amended, expanded and confirmed as follows:

- Surveillance / Monitoring of hot spots within all mines
- Control / Management of hot spots

Actions-

Weekly FLIR flights over Latrobe Valley to identify potential ignition points (hot spots) have been discontinued and will now be conducted on an as needed basis.—Permanent mine monitoring required

Current Status:

GDF Suez Two trailer mounted FLIR cameras being purchased to monitor northern batters in particular and monitored through Control Centre. Follow up TIC monitoring in place

Yallourn: CCTV for smoke detection around mine. Operations Fire Tower staffed

Loy Yang: Continual CCTV monitoring of mine and surrounds and TIC capacity
